# Trinity Times December 2021

## Pastor Tim Nappe's Paragraph

***"(Mary) was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be." (Luke 1:29)***

***"But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart." (Luke 2:19)***

**Definition of "Ponder" – (verb) – "Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion."**

"Ponder" is an interesting word. In the New Revised Standard Version of the New Testament, the word is only used three times, all in the first two chapters of Luke. And two out of three uses of the word are by Mary, the mother of Jesus.

The first time it is used, in Luke 1:29, Mary is pondering the angel Gabriel's visit and greeting to her. Gabriel is about to tell her that she is going to conceive and bear a son who will be called the Son of the Most High. He is going to be sent by God to deliver His people. God will have a very special purpose for this child and Mary is going to bring Him into the world and raise Him as her own child. That is a lot to ponder!

The second time that Mary ponders in the book of Luke is in chapter 2, verse 19. This is after Jesus has been born and the shepherds showed up at the stable to worship Him. The shepherds were enthusiastically telling about their own visit with multitudes of angels and the announcement that they had heard concerning this baby born in Bethlehem. Again, Mary ponders their words and the wonders about this baby lying in the manger next to her.

And even though Luke is the only one who tells us about Mary's pondering, I am sure that she spent a lot of time wondering and reflecting on the responsibility that God had entrusted to her and Joseph.

They have been called upon to raise, teach, nurture, and protect the Son of God who would grow to be the Savior of the World!

What an enormous responsibility!

During the Season of Advent, Mary becomes an example for all of us. She spends time reflecting and prayerfully considering what God has called her to do. There had to be many times that she felt inadequate and unprepared. But she was willing to entrust herself into the hands of the God who created and called her for this momentous occasion.

Advent is intended to be a time of preparation as we prepare our hearts and our homes to receive Jesus. It has a dual purpose of preparing for Christmas, but also preparing for the time when Christ will come again to gather in the faithful.

I invite you to join Mary and to follow her example. Ponder the mystery of what God is doing in the world around you, and how He is using you accomplish His purpose. Ponder the power and majesty of our wonderful God! And ponder the blessing of being His child!

### **Committee Reports:**

**Worship:** It was felt that the children's bags have taken the place of having a children's bulletin and that was enough. Sharon will check with Brandon if it can be emailed or must be physically mailed. Thank yous were read from Bright Beginnings for the noisy offering from October and a check for \$200 and note thanking us for the use of Trinity for the WIC program.

### **Old Business:**

Nominating Committee is continuing to get people to agree to serve on the council and is hopeful that there will be interest expressed on the volunteer sheets that have been handed out. Sheryl will hand out sheets Sunday and ask they be turned in at the close of services.

With the bank loan being near completion, the building fund committee will be asked to present to the council the move forward plan to pay off the member loans.

It was decided to place a note in the bulletin for the next two weeks that November 28<sup>th</sup> will be the last chance to contribute to the bank loan payment or we will use the \$10,000 for the bank loan.
