# **Trinity Times November 2022** Pastor Tim Nappe's Paragraph

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

### (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

If you were to wander around in the self-help section of the Barnes and Noble bookstore, you would find hundreds, if not thousands of books that would give you instructions on how to lead a happy, healthy, joyful, fulfilling life.

There would be advice about your physical, mental, emotional, psychological, and spiritual well-being. Some of those books might have some worth while advice, but I think they can all be summarized by these words from the Apostle Paul in 1 Thessalonians. ### **Committee Reports:**

**Worship and Music:** Luci reported that she is working with Kelly Jacobsma to put together some special music. Brenda Krahling is working on the Christmas program. Reformation Sunday is Oct. 30th, and All Saints Sunday is Nov. 6th.

**Christian Ed:** We discussed Christmas bags for the children. They will check on getting a Thrivent Card to support this. Their program will be given Dec. 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Stewardship:** Discussed an idea of collecting items for Upper Des Moines for the noisy offering or cash for meat or milk certificates. We are waiting to hear their needs. Also, we talked about Project Christmas Child. There is an envelope on the table to mail your \$10 contribution for mailing. The church will not be collecting the money. The boxes will be opened to make sure they go to the appropriate area for the items packed.

**Evangelism/Mission:** Discussing additional ideas for mission projects and the prayer room has been painted by Bev Nappe and furniture and accessories will soon be purchased for the room. \$10,000 was donated to do the room by the Lawrence Helmers family. Any funds not used will be at the council's discretion to spend where needed.

**Building and Property:** Because of settling in the entry, the seal on a window popped. When the new window was ordered, it was the same size as the original and did not fit well. It broke when replacing it but should be replaced this week. Two windows in the office have already been replaced because of popped seals. Concrete is still hoped to be laid before the snow flies. Seivert's are ordering the bench in memory of Brian, and it will take eight to ten weeks for it to arrive.

### **COUNCIL MINUTES continued**

### Executives:

Six applications have been received for the Folker's Scholarship. We award three each year and will be working on that.

### Old Business:

Five people signed up to help with the 125<sup>th</sup> celebration on the Small Group Surveys that have just been completed. We will need to establish a budget for the 125<sup>th</sup> celebration.

A second estimate to replace the AC/Condenser for the Sanctuary was sought but Paul was told he could not do it any cheaper than Stanton's Sheet Metal. A motion was made by Paul and seconded by Jan to go ahead with Stanton's and pay for it from the furnace account. All voted Aye.

We will start working on the 2023 budget with Sharon and Pastor starting the process. The execs will then work on it, and it will be presented to the council at our November meeting.

The nominating committee is Adam, Paul, and Sandy. We are all encouraged to talk to members to agree to serve on the council and refer them to the nominating committee.

New Member Sunday is October 23<sup>rd</sup> and currently there are no new members. The two who were interested in joining are moving from the area and so their plans have changed.

There have been issues with the sound system again and Omega Organ & Audio will be contacted to look at it. It seems that one of the amplifiers is not working right.

### New Business:

Noisy offering for November and December will be used to collect items for Upper Des Moines.

A donation of \$25,000 was made and it was decided by the executives to use it to pay off the member loan. The interest was just paid so this was the perfect time to pay off that loan. The remainder will be used to pay the final member loan to the Endowment Fund. There is now \$52,000 remaining.

Questions have again been raised about the Bell Tower. It is a subject that has been addressed several times over the past years. Many members would like to hear the bell rung for our 125th Anniversary. It is felt the system is shot and obsolete. A new system would cost thousands of dollars. The Methodist Church has replaced their bell tower for their 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. It was done by the Alexander family. Daryl will check with them on what was done and what the cost would be.

October 30<sup>th</sup> the council is responsible for coffee fellowship.

Pastor was notified that the Iowa District LCMC Annual Conference will be held Saturday, November 12 at Clear Lake. Anyone interested in going should contact Pastor.


