Trinity Times August 2024 Pastor Tim Nappe's Paragraph

"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places."

(Ephesians 6:10-12)

During the month of August, each Sunday, we are going to be going through our Sermon Series on the Apostle Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. These verses from chapter six are one of the last messages that Paul wants to leave with his readers. It is also a good message for us to be aware of and to which we need to pay close attention.

Paul warns us that there are unseen powers and principalities that are at work in the world around us. He calls them "cosmic powers of this present darkness" and "spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places." Paul did want us or the Ephesians to be unaware or naïve about the supernatural battle that is being waged in the world around us.

We see evidence everyday of the death and destruction that is at work in our world. Paul reminds us that we are not engaged in a struggle against blood and flesh, but that this is a battle between good and evil, light and darkness, God and Satan.

Whether we recognize it or not, everyday we are walking around in a spiritual battlefield. The devil is at work, actively attacking the Kingdom of God and doing everything that he can to interfere with God's salvation work here on earth. God wants all people to be saved and come to faith. The devil is doing anything in his power to keep people from responding to the love of God. Unfortunately, there are casualties being injured and wounded everyday. Some are even perishing.

Paul wants us to know that God has provided us with armor and weapons to defend us against the onslaught of the enemy. And the whole armor of God is described in Ephesians 6. Some of the armor that God provides includes truth, righteousness, the gospel of peace, faith, salvation, the word of God, and prayer.

These are powerful weapons and they provide a strong defense against the attacks of the enemy. But they are only effective if we make use of them. Without them, we are weak, vulnerable, and defenseless. With them, we are protected.

May we, along with the whole Church, listen to Paul's advice. "Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armor of God, so that you many be able to stand against the wiles of the devil."


