September 8 WORSHIP TIME GOES BACK TO **1 0:00am**

Trinity Times September 2024 Pastor Tim Nappe's Paragraph

"³¹ Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. ³² He said all this quite openly"

(Mark 8:31-32a)

In the coming month, we are going to hear Jesus talk about His future more than once. He is going to try to be open and honest with His disciples about what is going to be happening to Him. But, the disciples don't want to hear it. This is not the future that they were envisioning. In fact, in one of the lessons that are coming up, Peter even argues with Jesus about what He is saying.

Jesus rebukes him, and says, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

We might not like to admit it, but we have a lot in common with Peter. There are times that we think that we have a better idea of what the future should look like than God does. We strike out in our own direction with our own ideas following our own priorities.

And there are times that God may need to call us aside and rebuke us for getting too far out ahead of Him. We are called to be followers of God, not to expect Him to follow us! There are going to be many times that we are not sure where God is going or what He is doing. But, we are not expected to make the decisions and set the agenda. That is up to God!

Our call is to trust and to follow where He leads. Jesus goes on to explain to His disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me."

That becomes the definition of a follower, a disciple of Jesus Christ. We:

Deny ourselves; Take up our cross, and; Follow Jesus.

None of those three are going to be easy. It goes against our nature to "deny ourselves." The world urges us to "indulge ourselves!" We are daily tempted to do whatever it is that might make us feel good or promote ourselves.

And it is not very pleasant to "take up our cross." That is going to require sacrifice and hardship. It is something that we would rather not do.

And as far as following, we would rather be out in front, going our own direction and doing our own thing.

But then we would have no right to call ourselves a follower or a disciple of Jesus Christ. Followers follow. We go where He calls us and we do what He tells us. We are under His authority. After all, we call Him, "Lord." May we be faithful followers!

New Business:


